

FINDING TREATMENT AND ACCESS TO CARE IS NOW EASIER.

The MSDH Medications for Substance Use Disorders (MSUD) program is available statewide to increase access to treatment for substance use disorder. This program seeks to address gaps in access to opioid and substance use disorder treatment by making it easier to get access to treatment.

Our goal is to assist individuals seeking treatment via an online referral form, connecting them with statewide navigators and peer support specialists. We assist

in finding suitable care, social supports, and post-treatment coordination. This form is open for use by state agencies, community-based organizations, or providers, particularly in overcoming treatment cost barriers.

HOW CAN AN INDIVIDUAL OR MY ORGANIZATION PARTICIPATE?

To access our services, individuals may complete the online referral form or contact our team directly for assistance. Our contact details are conveniently located on the inside flap of this brochure.

HOW DOES THE MSDH TREATMENT PROGRAM WORK?

First, you can fill out the online referral form, and one of our team members will contact you. You can also contact our team members at msud@msdh.ms.gov to get more information.

Once you have connected with us, one of the navigators from the MSUD team will call you to discuss your medication and treatment needs and arrange for them through the program.

If you have medication needs, the MSUD team will get them prescribed and delivered to you, and will connect you to one of the MSUD team's peer support specialists who will work with you.
